

Compliance with the UK Waste Electrical & Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Regulations



The Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Directive is now UK law. Sonic Communications (Int) Limited is committed to the environment and recognizes its responsibility as a producer of Electronic and Electrical Equipment (EEE) and welcomes the opportunity to provide safe ways to dispose of EEE waste. In order to limit the costs and risks which are passed onto our customers we have decided not to charge a "WEEE Levy" at the time of purchase of our products. With this in mind, we've created a Takeback and Recycle Program as part of our corporate social responsibility initiative.

Sonic Communications (Int) Ltd is classed as a producer with respect to Electrical and Electronic Equipment (EEE) for 'users other than private households' under The Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Regulations 2006.

Regulation 9 places an obligation on Sonic Communications (Int) Ltd to finance the costs of treatment, recovery and environmentally sound disposal of waste electronic equipment (WEEE) from our customers where that WEEE:

- (I) Is composed of equipment sold to our customers before 13 August 2005 and that is being replaced by products from Sonic Communications (Int) Ltd of the same type or that performs the same function.
- (II) Is composed of Sonic Communications (Int) Ltd equipment purchased by our customers after 13 August 2005.

Where Sonic Communications (Int) Ltd is responsible for WEEE under scenarios (I) or (II) above, it is the responsibility of the customer to deliver the WEEE in question to Sonic Communications (Int) Ltd.'s chosen recycling facility, after which point we will accept any further treatment or recycling costs.

Sonic Communications (Int) Ltd meet our responsibilities under the WEEE Regulations through membership of the DHL WEEE Compliance Scheme and as our chosen partner DHL are able to manage the process of WEEE collection, treatment and recycling in accordance with the standards laid out within the Regulations. We will not be responsible for WEEE originally produced by ourselves where our branding has been replaced with alternative branding, or where the WEEE has been converted or modified without our permission.

To arrange a collection of WEEE

1. Please contact Sonic Communications (Int) Ltd to allow us to ensure that the correct procedures can be applied.
2. We will liaise with DHL WEEE Compliance to agree the most appropriate treatment, recycling and recovery facility to send the WEEE.
3. DHL will contact you direct to arrange for the collection of the WEEE at a mutually convenient time – please note, transport and additional handling costs on your site are your responsibility.
